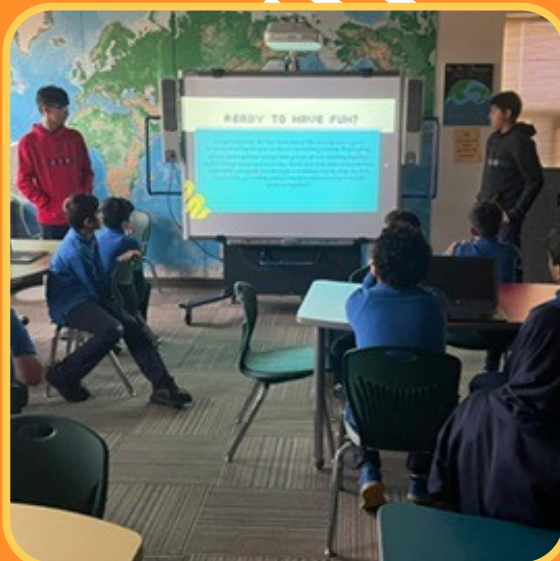

LIBRARY CORNER



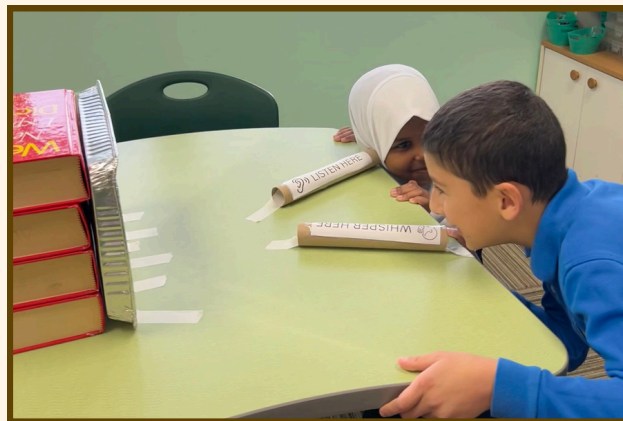
This month's reading challenge was to check out non-fiction books and share facts in a mini book. We learned about animals, indigenous tribes, and miracles of the prophets.



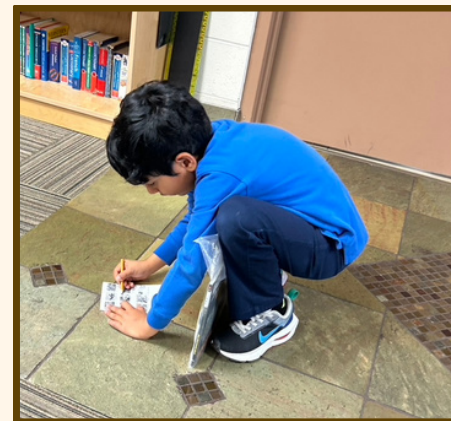
Inspired by our reading of "The One and Only Ivan," Grade 4 students drew a picture using only one crayon just like Ivan the gorilla.



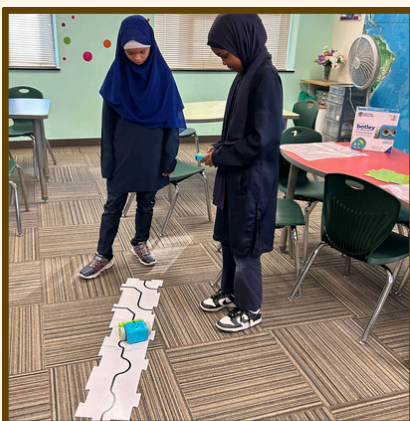
Preschool students hopped, crawled, and stomped on various animal tracks.
